

KINDERGARTEN MATHEMATICS

The purpose of the Kindergarten Math program is to provide the kindergarten children with daily exposure to age-appropriate math concepts and operations. A multi-sensory approach is used to make basic abstract math concepts familiar, concrete, and relevant.

Number Concepts

Students will:

- Identify numbers 0-30
- Identify numerals 0-30
- Learn correct written formation of numerals 0-30
- Will be able to rote count to 100
- Will be able to count to 100 by 10's, 5's
- Will be able to count to 20 by 2's

Positions & Patterns

Students will:

- Top, Middle, Bottom
- Inside, Outside
- Before, After, Between
- Be able to extend color patterns
- Extend shape patterns
- Create patterns using manipulatives

Shapes & Sorting

Students will:

- Identify circle, square, rectangle, triangle, oval
- Build pictures using shapes
- Alike and different
- Sorting by size, shape and color

Measurement

Students will:

- Compare height
- Compare length
- Compare weight
- Compare capacity
- Compare size and shape
- Compare more/less
- Make graphs

Money and Time

Students will:

- Identify penny, nickel, dime, quarter
- Tell time on the hour and half hour

- Learn the days of the week
- Learn the months of the year
- Use a daily calendar

Computation

Students will:

- Explore the concept of addition
- Explore the concept of subtraction
- Build addition and subtraction sentences
