

2010-2011 Standardized Test Results

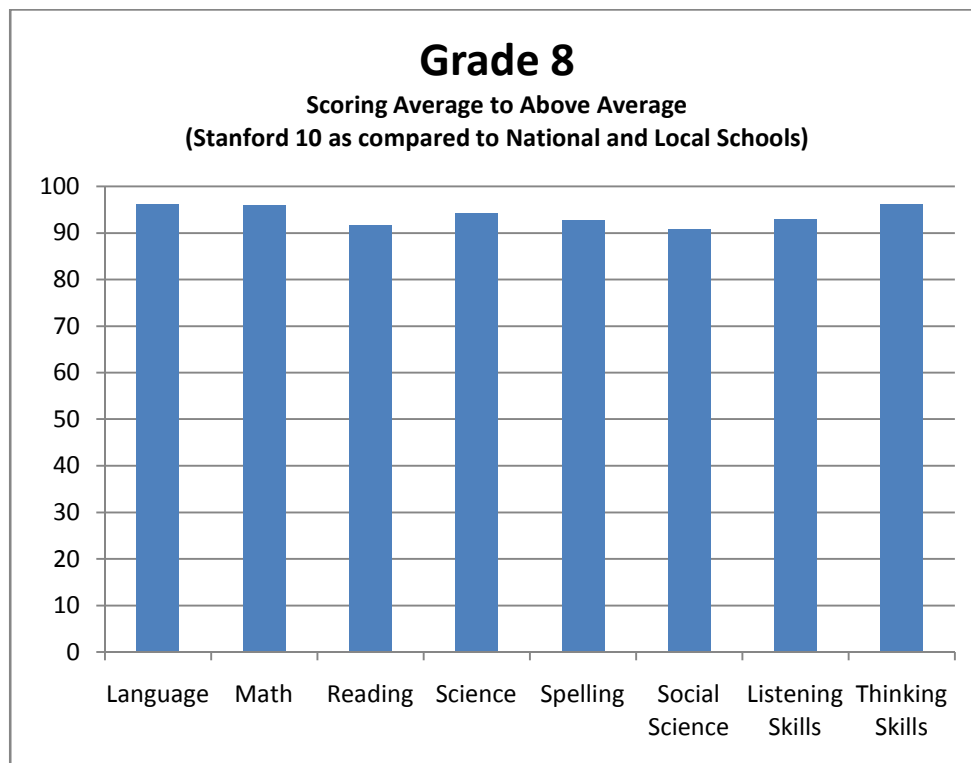
Attached you will find the Assessment Summary for Grades 1-8 as provided by Stanford 10. These summaries show how our students performed on each objective.

All elementary schools in the Archdiocese of Boston administered The Stanford 10 in March 2010. In addition, many private and catholic schools across the nation take this test. We use the testing results to provide valuable insights into areas of the school's strengths and needs. Standardized testing provides an external assessment of our academic progress as a whole. The test results are used to improve instructional strategies, develop curriculum and monitor growth over time.

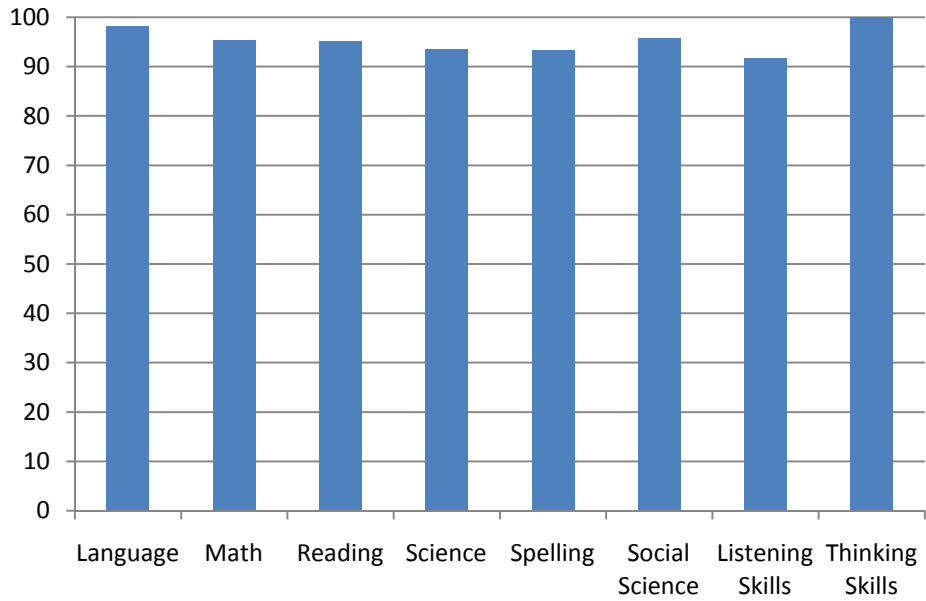

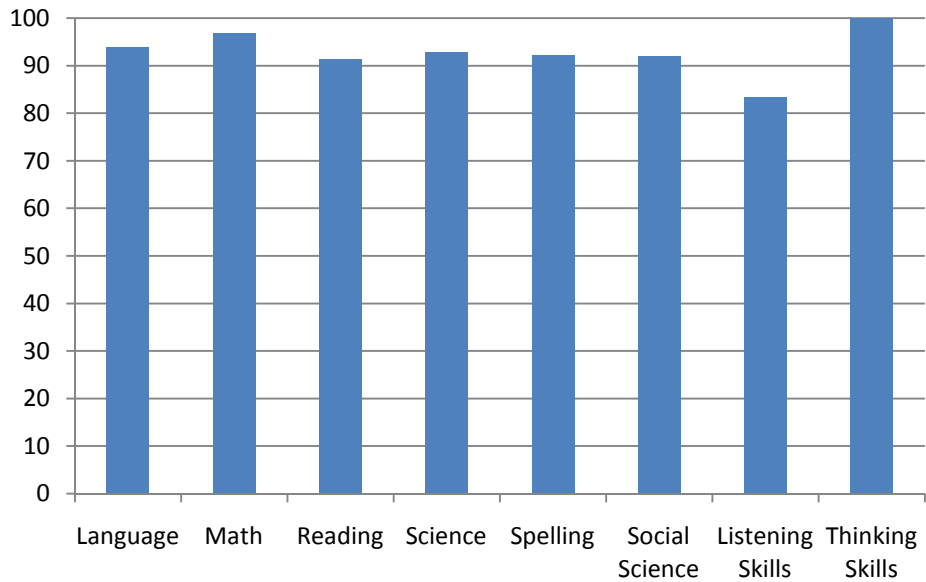

(Stanford 10 as compared to National and Local Schools)



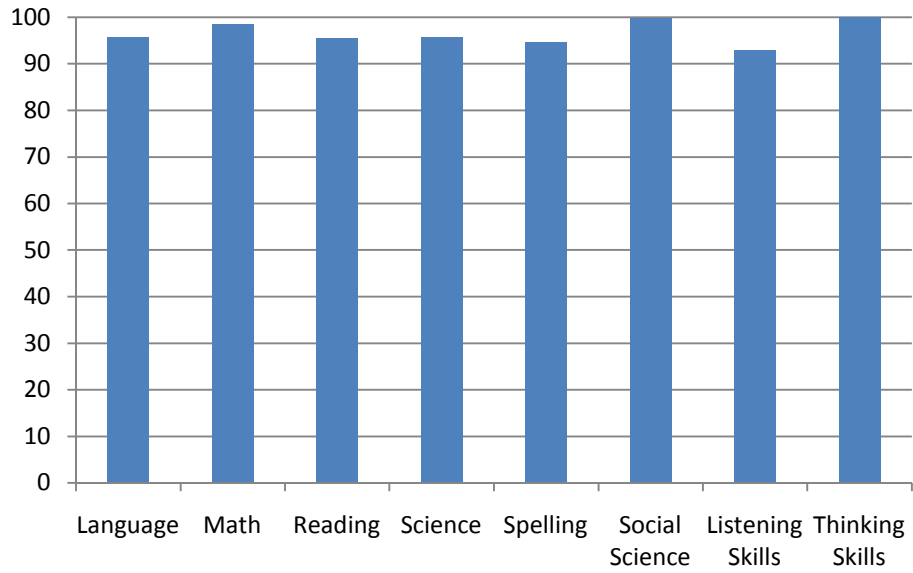
Grade 6

(Stanford 10 as compared to National and Local Schools)



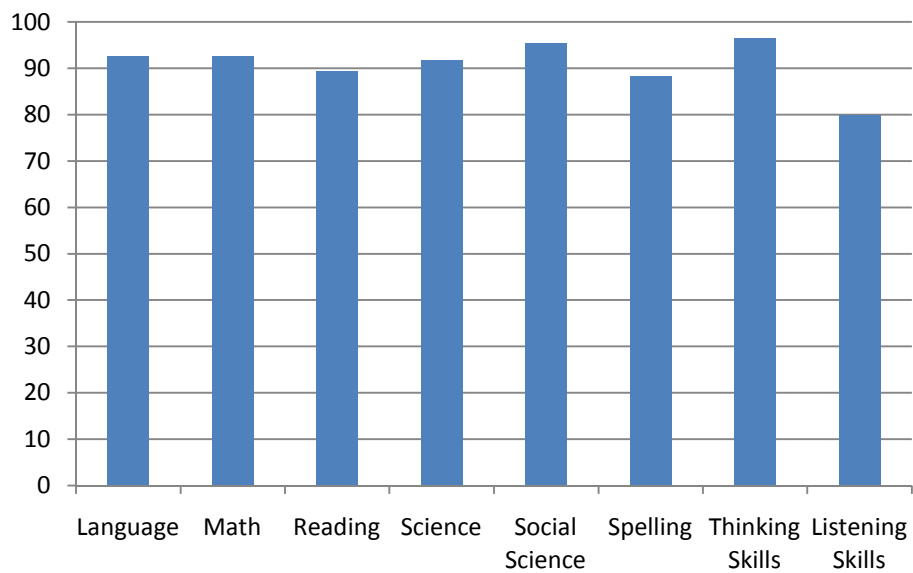

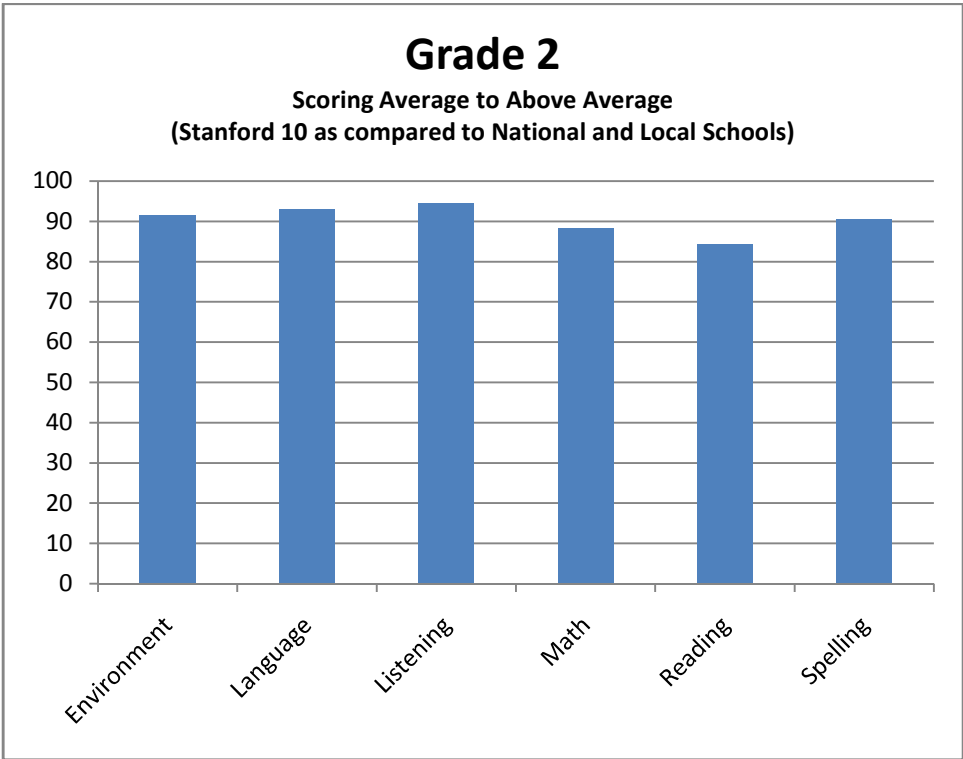
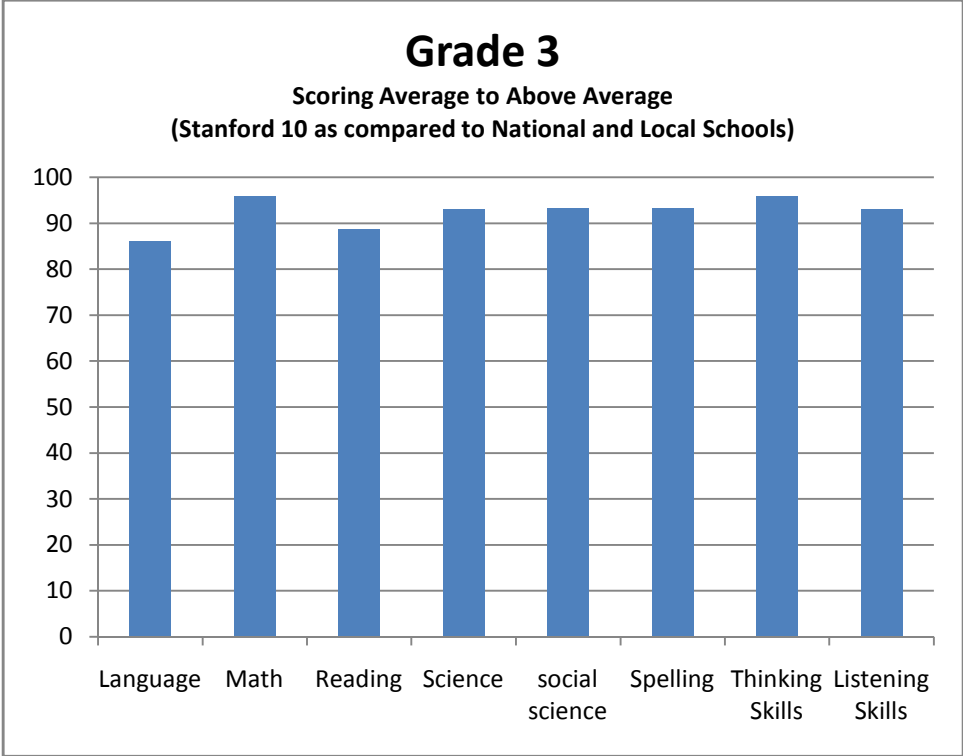
Scoring Average to Above Average

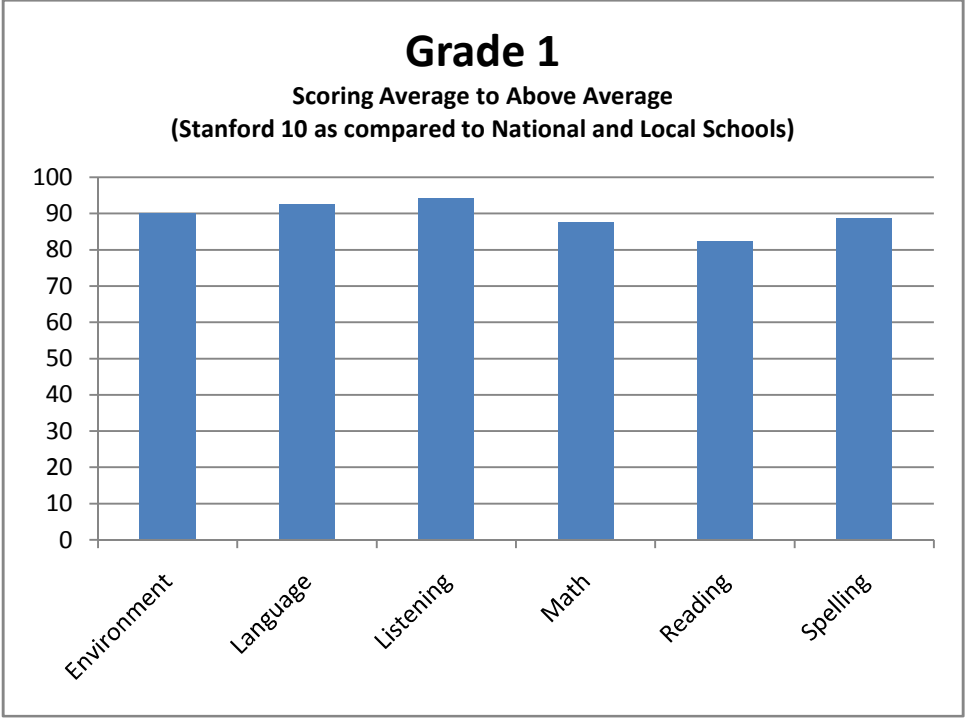
