

Dear Soon-To-Be Third Grade Student,

We would like to welcome you to the third grade! We are giving you this list of supplies to help you prepare over the summer. You will need the following items for the third grade:

- 3 Highlighters
- 4 Expo Markers (**low odor**)
- an old sock (to wipe off white board)
- addition flashcards and 0-12 subtraction flashcards (**that include up to 18-9 and 9+9**)  
*\*The subtraction flashcards are difficult to find in stores. They can be found on Amazon.com. Feel free to make flashcards at home or print them off of a website.*
- multiplication/division flashcards
- 50 index cards (white lined)
- 2 composition books (instead of notebooks) 9 3/4" x 7 1/2"  
(writing, reading,)
- Ruler (inches)
- 2 or 3 Rubber erasers (no collectibles/toy erasers)
- 1 box crayons (please put in zip lock bag with name on it)
- 1 box colored pencils (please put in zip lock bag with name on it)
- Individual pencil sharpener (Staples brand sharpens well)
- 1 pair of scissors
- 6 large glue sticks
- 3" Post it Notes
- 3 folders (stay at school, homework, social studies)(no bulky trapper keepers/binders)
- Pencil bag (no big pencil holders/boxes)
- 2 extra large book covers (brown paper bags can be used)
- 1 box of sharpened pencils (at least 50) We will have them store these in the classroom

When completed with the reading, each child is asked to complete the attached book report sheet. **You need to write 2 sentences about your favorite character from the story and draw a picture in the box that goes along with your writing. You need to include the name of the book and the author's name. Your picture should be colored in. Please be sure to write your name and the date too! This assignment should be your neatest work!**

This packet includes an addition and subtraction drill worksheet. We will not be collecting these practice drills in September. It is expected that you will be able to pass these drills. You should be able to do this in **5 minutes**. You will be given a subtraction and an addition drill upon return from summer vacation. **These drills will be graded and will be the first math grades you receive in the third grade.** You may find the website <http://www.math-drills.com/> to be useful. This site allows you to make and print off additional drills at home. We find that one of the best ways for students to practice their facts is by taking written drills since this is the way that they will be assessed and graded in class.





