



In science, the students are learning about animal structures. They researched an animal and wrote about the animal's structures that help the animal survive.





















Grade 5 Math

Have a happy and healthy Thanksgiving.










The Class of 2024 had a great time on their retreat. The Ice Bucket Challenge was a success! Thank you to everyone who came out to support the class of 2024!


