The month of February is the shortest in the calendar year so when you add a week-long winter vacation to it, it gets even shorter. Somehow, the amazing staff at school find creative ways to push through curriculum, prepare students, celebrate Valentine's Day, and much, more in three short weeks.

Catholic Schools Week was a wonderful week at St. Michael School. The kick-off CSW Mass was wonderful! So many students attended and helped us by proclaiming the readings, acting as altar servers/choir singers and more. I want to publicly thank our teachers and staff for their donations of raffle items for the PTO Teacher Raffles during Catholic Schools Week. They donated items or experiences for all of the different age groups in our school. Coming up soon is one of my favorite events that the PTO sponsors... the Book Fair (March 5-7). The children love selecting books to read and they feel proud purchasing them on their own. We are pleased to offer the summer reading books as well so you can order in advance.

The season of Lent began on February 14th as we celebrated Ash Wednesday. Our K-8 students all attended mass while our early childhood students were visited by a parish staff member to receive their ashes. Lent is a 40 day season of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving that begins on Ash Wednesday and ends at sundown on Holy Thursday. During these days, our students will focus on Lent during their religious classes and we'll encourage them to share with you what they've learned.

Our school is currently undergoing a Self Study for our 10-year Accreditation through The New England Association of Schools and Colleges (NEASC). We will have two upcoming visits from NEASC. The first will be a Foundation Standard visit in the Spring of 2025. Following that visit, a team of 8 NEASC members will visit our school in the Fall of 2025 for a 3-day visit focusing on the remaining standards. This is our third round of accreditation, and it is vital to our school's success to always be looking at what we do and how we can improve. Part of that process will be to send surveys to our parents and students. We ask that you complete any surveys that are sent to help us better evaluate areas of improvement.

Term II report cards were issued earlier in the month. While we don't have official parent-teacher conferences at this time of the year, parents are always welcome to reach out to schedule a meeting with any concerns/questions.

Finally, we are out of school from Feb. 19-23 on school's winter break. I hope you use this special week to enjoy family time, go skiing/sledding, visit a local museum and more.

- Homework assignments are posted in the Google Classroom, on the Saavas website, as well as in their agendas. Grades are posted in Renweb.


Report card grading will remain the same based on conduct and effort. Being prepared for class, doing their assignments and respecting classroom rules will be reflected in their overall conduct grade.


