In addition to gutting the bathrooms and making them age-appropriate for our pre-k, kindergarten and first graders, we are also excited to be building two adult lavatories that can be used by staff as well as visiting parents. Due to the cost of the project, we had to work closely with the Archdiocese of Boston and had to use a pre-approved list of contractors for the job. The work is expected to begin immediately following the last day of school and is expected to be completed before the first day of school in August. This project has been on our long-range plan and we are excited to be able to tackle it. Over the past few years, we have additionally renovated the "Old School" by installing new windows and brightening up the hallways and classrooms with fresh paint! Due to the timing of the eleven week project, the last day of school has been revised. See important email that was sent home.

During this Lenten season, our students have been preparing for Easter. As a reminder, the school will be closed on Friday, March 29th for Good Friday. We will celebrate Jesus' Resurrection on Easter Sunday. Look for Mass times in the Trumpet that week.






Grade 5 and 6 celebrate Pi DAY 3.14159265...

Grades 5 and 6 explored circumferences and diameters of a circle. We used Pi, a ratio, to help calculate problems. No pies though!








Grade 5 and 6 Minds at Work




Mrs. Berard 5th Grade Science

Mrs. Ordway 7th Grade ELA Grade 7 completed their unit on Hamlet by comparing two media forms: the play to the movie, Lion King!
















Mr. A: Science 7/8


Mrs. Parker: 7/8 Math













