We will continue identifying projects to keep these upgrades moving along so that someday we will no longer refer to that building as "the old school."

Finally, our Annual Fund will help make St. Michael School more affordable for families who are struggling with the everincreasing costs in today's society. Choosing a Catholic education is a very expensive gift that parents can give their children. Yet, affording the tuition can often be a hardship for many. Each year, we have almost one hundred families apply for financial aid via an online portal called FACTS. This online portal helps to identify those most in need. Unfortunately, we almost always fall short on matching the financial needs of our families.

The Class of 2025 had a great time on their class retreat. The students participated in the Ice Bucket Challenge and raised money for hurricane relief.






Mrs. Parker: 7/8 Math




