

How Do Families Receive a Parishioner Tuition Rate?



During Catholic Schools Week, the third graders paired up with the seventh graders to read. We are hoping to pair up again to complete a Lenten project in March.
























### Mrs. Parker: 7/8 Math












## Simple Machines Grade 3














### Technology
