






Mrs. Nagle: 7/8 Social Studies

After studying our parts of speech, the class created and flew paper airplanes. They composed a 100-word descriptive paragraph about the flight, highlighting prepositions!
















Mr. A: Science 7/8

Congratulations to all of the eighth-grade students that were accepted to so many wonderful Catholic and private schools. I am proud of you all.














The students in 8th grade used the microscopes to view a wide range of prepared slides to get a glimpse of the simple yet complicated makeup of our world.

Coding the robots to draw an L and a T was challenging but each team accomplished the task!























