

Dear Friends & Alumni of Saint Michael School,

This year marks our 75th anniversary of providing an exceptional Catholic school education to our students! In addition to celebrating our current students and staff, we are celebrating each of you! YOU are an important part of our history which is helping us form our future!

From your experience with Saint Michael School and Parish, you know that Saint Michael School is a vibrant facility that is gifted with terrific students and an outstanding and dedicated faculty. These factors come together, along with a strong faith in Christ, to deliver a unique and powerful way for our children to learn.

I'm writing today to ask for your support with our Annual Fund. Over the past years, your prayers and gifts to the school Annual Fund have played an important role in our school's success! We are very fortunate to have a robust student population, serving over five hundred twenty students this year! Our tuition rates remain competitive yet mostly affordable to our school families who come from over twenty different towns and cities in our area. Our Annual Fund this year will focus on two areas that the school has identified as our greatest needs: upgrades to our outdoor play spaces and financial assistance.

Our backyard artificial turf is now twenty years old and it is showing its age. We received quotes last spring and were astonished to find that we need to replace, not repair the turf. That cost alone is over \$75,000. Additional upgrades are also needed on the school playgrounds.

Families desire a Catholic school but the tuition can be a cause for a family to not enroll. We are dedicated to helping all families who desire a Catholic education, to receive one. Each year, we have almost one hundred families apply for financial aid via an online portal called FACTS. This online portal helps to identify those most in need. While we are fortunate to help many families through our own funding, Catholic Schools Foundation funding and private funding, there is still a gap in need versus available aid.

Your donation, no matter the size, will have a tremendous impact on the students, staff, families and programs at St. Michael School. Please consider donating to our Annual Fund as a means of showing your support for the outstanding Catholic education that Saint Michael School provided to you when you attended, to your own children when they attended or to your grandchildren, who attend now. 


# Grade 3























#### Mr. A: Science 7/8


