

In science, students became junior meteorologists as they explored different types of clouds and what they can tell us about the weather. By observing cloud shapes and heights, students learned how to predict when a storm might be on its way. They also discovered that wind direction plays an important role, since which way the wind is blowing can affect whether storm clouds are moving toward us or away from us. Students practiced using their new knowledge to make weather predictions just like real scientists.
