Dear Soon-To-Be Third Grade Student,

We would like to welcome you to the third grade! We are giving you this list of supplies to help you prepare over the summer. You will need the following items for the third grade:

- 3 Highlighters
- 6 Expo Makers (low odor)
- an old sock (to wipe off white board)
- multiplication/division flashcards (if your child uses flashcards to study. These will be kept at home)
- 1 composition books (instead of notebooks) 9 ¾” and 7 ½”
- 2 or 3 rubber erasers (no collectibles/toy erasers)
- cap erasers (for tops of pencils)
- 1 box of crayons (please put in zip lock bag with name on it)
- 1 box of colored pencils (please put in zip lock bag with name on it)
- individual pencil sharpener
- 1 pair of scissors
- 6 large glue sticks
- 3 packs of 3” Post it Notes
- 3 folders (no bulky trapper keepers/binders)
- pencil bag (no big pencil holders/boxes)
- 1 extra large book cover (brown paper bags can be used)
- 1 box of sharpened pencils (at least 50). We will have them store these in the classroom

We will also be accepting donations of:

- tissues
- Wet Ones (no Clorox wipes, please)

**Before coming to school, please label all supplies with names or initials.**

This includes: crayons and colored pencil bags, scissors, glue sticks, flashcards folders, composition books, etc.

- Any A-Z Mystery Book: written by Ron Roy
- Fudge-a-Mania: written by Judy Blume
- Judy Moody Saves the World: written by Megan McDonald

When completed with the reading, each child is asked to complete the attached book report sheet. **You need to write 2 sentences about your favorite scene from the story and draw a picture in the box that goes along with your writing. Please make sure you read over the rubric BEFORE beginning to work on this. The rubric shows how you will be graded on the assignment.**

This packet includes 2 addition and 2 subtraction drill worksheets. It is expected that you know these facts upon entering grade three. Our main focus will be multiplication and we will only spend a short amount of time reviewing basic addition and subtraction facts. If you do not know them by memory, it is important that you study them over vacation. You may find the website <http://www.math-drills.com> to be useful. This site allows you to make and print off additional drills at home. Students will have graded drills/assessments on these facts at the beginning of third grade.

**Students should pass in the addition, subtraction and reading report the first week of school. These will be graded.**


