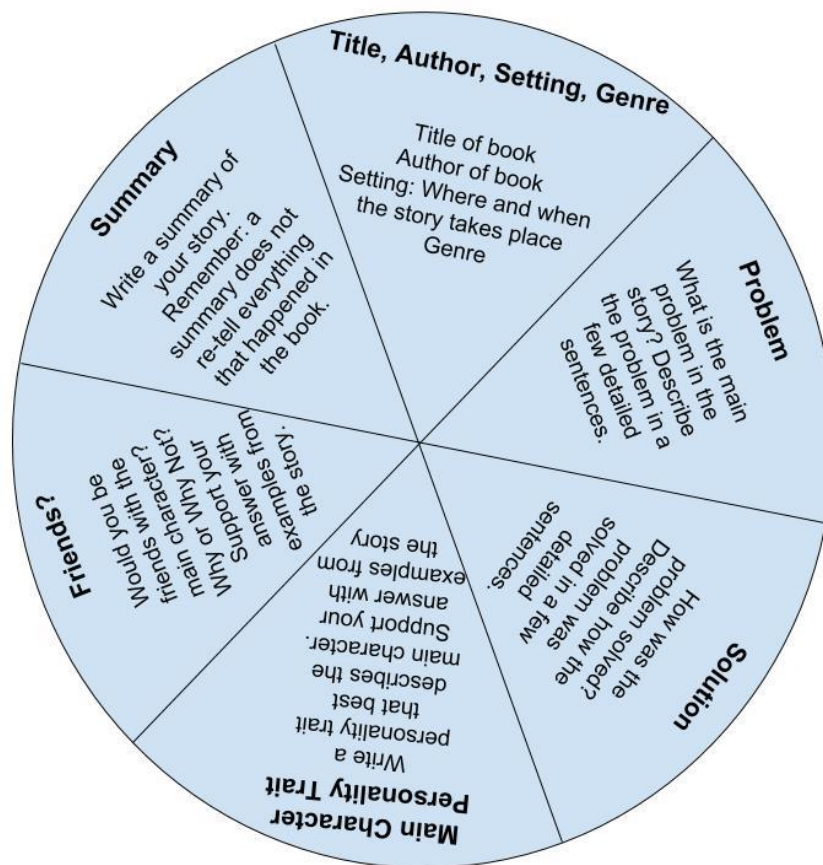

## 6th Grade Summer Reading Book Report- Pizza, Pizza!

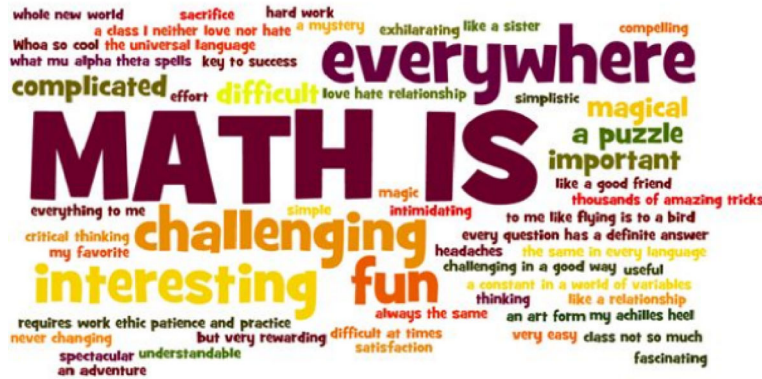
